A Working Group consisting of Parish Councillors, residents and CBC Councillor Silvia Collins are trying to save the Annapurna Centre in Leighton Road and to get it back into a fit state for community use.

This building was part of the old village school and was built circa 1927 to inspire young people. It has a special place in many residents' hearts but it has been scheduled for demolition by Central Bedfordshire Council and their intention is to replace it with housing.

The Group will be presenting a case to the Council's Executive in October and want to show that this building is important to our residents and is a valuable asset that can continue to serve our residents present and future.
